

Painted pebbles are fun to make and can brighten up your garden terrace or pots. Use them as plant labels for your crops, use for a treasure hunt or even practice your counting.

Prepare your pebbles

Collect some nice looking pebbles and make sure they are washed and dried before you begin.

Go on a bug safari and look at growing flowers or pictures in books to get ideas of what to paint on your stones.

Top tip: choose a theme or topic to create a collection such as ladybirds.

Equipment needed

- □ Medium sized pebbles
- □ Pencil
- ☐ Coloured permanent pens or acrylic paint for decorations
- ☐ Clear nail varnish or PVA glue and brush



- 1. Use a pencil to draw a design on the pebble.
- 2. Colour in the design using acrylic paints or permanent pens. Leave to dry.
- 3. When the paint or ink is dry, take a clean brush and carefully cover the pebbles in PVA glue or clear nail varnish to make them weatherproof. Leave to dry.
- 4. Display your pebbles at home or give them away as beautiful gifts!
